This paper was revised and abridged version of a research report to the Provisional Government of Taiwan (1989). It was first published as a paper in a collection of papers on Taiwan religions by Hei-yuan Chiu in 1997.

3. On the development of the Catholic Church in Taiwan

The Chinese version of this paper was published in volume fifty one of the Bulletin of Institute of Ethnology, Academia Sinica in 1982.

4. An investigation into government laws and regulations on religions in Taiwan

This paper was revised and abridged version of a research report to the Ministry of Interior (1988). It was first published as a paper in a collection of papers on Taiwan religions by Hei-yuan Chiu in 1997.

5. Comparative study of religious education in selected countries: On providing religious education in Taiwan

This paper was revised and abridged version of a research report to the Ministry of Education (1995). It was first published as a paper in a collection of papers on Taiwan religions by Hei-yuan Chiu in 1997.

6. On the phenomena of new religions in Taiwan

The Chinese version of this article was published in Hsu, Cheng-kuang and Wen-li Sung (edited) New movements in Taiwan in1989.

7. Popularity of occultism and social change in Taiwan

The Chinese version of this paper was published in volume twenty eight of Taiwanese Journal of Sociology in 1996.
